DURING A FULL HARVEST MOON, YOU EXPERIENCE 12 HOURS OF DAYLIGHT FROM THE SUN AND 12 HOURS OF MOONLIGHT FROM THE MOON – IF YOU WATCH THE MOON SET BEFORE SUNRISE, IT'LL BE ORANGE AGAIN – AS IT CASTS ITS REFLECTED LIGHT THROUGH A THICKER ATMOSPHERE.
